FROM THE DEAN

Wow! What an incredible week at camp! 120 kids, 25 staff members, and an untold amount of memories. It's been one of the best weeks of camp I can remember. We have so much to be grateful for. So much to thank God for.

Our theme verse was Romans 16:19, "...but I want you to be wise about what is good, and innocent about what is evil." We used that verse as our launching pad to teach your camper about good, bad, heroes, and villains. You see, we live in a time where the line between good and bad has been blurred. Sometimes it's hard for us to know who the hero is or what a villain looks like. Our goal was to open God's word and see what HE has to say.

During our mission time each day, the kids were introduced to the work of Central India Christian Mission. Specifically, they learned how CICM is actively involved in redeeming children their age from slavery and human trafficking. For as little as \$100 a child can be rescued from that way of life and placed with a Christian family. They'll also receive health-care, an education, and adequate food. Thanks to the generosity of campers and parents alike, we've raised over \$1,000. That means our camp will be able to impact the lives of as many as 10 children who are currently enslaved. Kids just like these, who we met in 2016.
