FROM THE DEAN

The average American child spends 270 minutes watching TV, 82 minutes on the phone, 80 minutes playing video games, and 27 minutes on the computer, or a total of 7.5 hours a day on electronic media. That is 2,712 hours or 113 days a year. The overage American child averages only 4 minutes of playing outside. This week at camp has been a great departure from this. There was no time spent on phones, video games, computers or watching tv (with the exception of an option to watch a movie on Tuesday when it was raining). The campers were able to play outside, between rec time, free time, and team time for at least 4 hours, rather than 4 minutes, a day.

Our theme has been, incredible. We serve an incredible God. The overarching theme has been God is incredible not only because of His power, but also because of how much he loves us. The campers were divided into eight teams. These teams chose their team name and story. As a team they began each day, after breakfast, with a devotional that set up the theme for the day. They also went to classes twice a day. The first class went through Philippians, one Chapter a day. The second class time included a hands on teambuilding exercise, a personal testimony, journaling, and a study about the nature of God.

There were three recreation periods each day, they were able to chose what they wanted to do. Choices included swimming, games, crafts, science experiments, and more. In the evenings our worship was based upon gaining a better understanding of who Jesus is and how He is incredible. In the evenings there was a special event each evening. These included, water Olympics, water games, a talent show, staff hunt, and student led science experiments that taught a spiritual lesson. While rain was a bit of an issue a few days, we worked around it and God provided.

This week has been filled with laughter, learning, and worship. It is my prayer the campers left being closer to Christ and have experienced the love of many counselors. Thank you for the opportunity to learn, play, and grow together this week. Please remember, Jesus loves you, and so do I. Bane Angles, Dean
